### **The Integumentary System**

The Endocrine System •The Endocrine System includes the sex hormones that stimulate sebaceous and apocrine gland activity, and develop secondary sexual characteristics; suprarenal hormones alter blood flow to skin and mobilize lipids from fat cells •The Integumentary System synthesizes vitamin D<sub>3</sub>, precursor of calcitriol, a hormone produced

### **The Integumentary System**

Functions of the Integumentary system 1 protection a) chemical factors in the skin: Sebum (or oil) from the sebaceous glands is slightly acidic, retarding bacterial colonization on the skin surface Sweat from the sudoriferous glands is slightly hypertonic and can flush off most bacteria on the skin surface

The integumentary system consists of the skin, hair, nails, the subcutaneous tissue below the skin, and assorted glands The most obvious function of the integumentary system is the protection that the skin gives to underlying tissues The skin not only keeps most harmful substances out, ...
