A Palestinian Perspective on the Arab-Israeli Conflict

The Arab-Israeli conflict is indeed derivative of the Palestine problem All the Arab-Israeli wars of the last three decades were derivatives of the Palestine problem Such was the case with the wars of 1948, 1956, and 1967, the Attrition War of 1969-70, the war of 1973, the invasion of Lebanon in 1978, and the martyrdom of Beirut in 1982
